Undergraduate Program Application
Due: Third Friday of August

Applications to the BSEd in English Education are due the third Friday in August, and will be evaluated by a committee of program faculty members. Although the program has minimum requirements (e.g., 2.5 undergraduate GPA, 50 hours of experiences with learners), most applicants greatly exceed the minimum. Those candidates whose grades do not represent their future potential should use the essay portions of the application to make their case for admission.

Prior to admission, applicants should have consulted with the English education advisor in Student Services, 122 Aderhold Hall, Athens GA 30602. Advisors can counsel applicants in how to arrange their programs of study prior to application so that they are positioned for enrollment.

The program enrolls a maximum of 25 students each year, and in most years is highly competitive. Applicants should thus take the greatest care possible in meeting or exceeding the stated minimum requirements and preparing their applications to best represent their cases for admission.

Affirmation:

By applying to the Undergraduate program in English Education, you are agreeing to the following:

- Completion of all ENGL coursework prior to the second block (Fall semester) of the program.
- Maintaining a minimum 2.5 overall GPA.
- Passing or Exempted scores of the GACE Program Admission Assessment.
- Issuance of the Pre-Service Certificate by the end of the Fall semester in which you apply.
- Attendance at a mandatory orientation scheduled for 5:00pm approximately 4 weeks after the application deadline.
- If you choose to forego student teaching and certification, you must complete the approved “Educational Studies” track to graduate with a degree in English Education.
- Must attend an advising appointment prior to the program orientation. All future advising appointments will be done in a group setting.

1. What does the number of your GPA not convey about your academic experiences?

3. Please articulate your sense of what a good teacher does. Be sure to attend to the ways in which highly effective teachers address the needs of a wide range of learners. There is no word limit to this response!
4. Please provide a detailed log of pre-professional experiences. Use a separate page (but save as one file) for each experience and provide: (1) Site Name (2) Hours Served (3) Supervisor Contact Information (4) A detailed description in the body of each page.
