## The topics covered will be:

- ◆ **Understanding & Coping with Your Hearing Loss**

Find out more about the anatomy of the ear, the types of hearing loss, how hearing loss is measured, and practical ways to cope with your hearing loss.

- ◆ **Maximizing Use of Your Hearing Aids**

Learn how hearing aids work, how to care for your hearing aid, basic troubleshooting, the advantages of different kinds of hearing aids, and strategies to maximize the benefits of your hearing aid.

- ◆ **The Theory and Practice of Lip/Speechreading**

Speechreading involves watching the movements of the face and body of your conversation partner to increase your understanding of their thoughts and increase your ability to communicate. Learn the theory and some specific strategies that you will begin to practice in class.

- ◆ **Strategies for Successfully Improving Communication**

Your hearing aid will increase the amount that you hear and perceive, but it may not fully meet your needs in every circumstance. Learn specific strategies for dealing with difficult communication situations and about additional technology that may improve your ability to function in a hearing world.
